Vocabulary

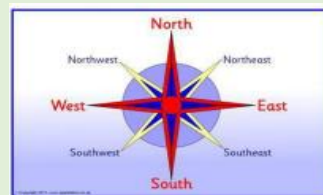
Map	A diagram of a place drawn from above.
Grid Reference	A location on a map shown by letters and numbers.
4 Figure Grid Reference	A location on a map shown by 4 letters and numbers.
6 Figure Grid Reference	A location on a map shown by 6 letters and numbers.
Bird's Eye View	The view of an area from above.
Key	Symbols used on a map to show features.
Urban Areas	Towns and cities.
County	Dividing up countries into areas which contain many settlements. They have their own council.
Rural	Countryside areas.
Cotton Spinning	The process of how cotton is made into yarn.
Samuel Crompton 	He was a famous inventor. He invented the spinning mule which spun cotton.

 - Antarctica

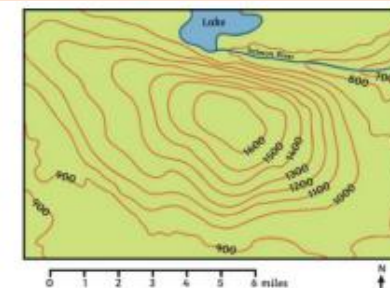
4) Know the 8 points on the compass:
