Region	An area of land which contains many places and counties
Village	A small settlement where people live.
Town	A medium sized place where people live.
City	A large, populated place where people live.
Landmark	A feature which helps you to recognise a place.
Location	Where a place is.
Physical feature	A natural feature.
Human feature	A feature built of put there by humans.
Tourism	When people visit places.
Country	A large area of land which has a government.
County	An large area of land which is larger than a city and has its own council.
Borough	A settlement which has its own mini government, or council.



Need to know knowledge:

- 1) Know that the biggest cities in the North West of England are: **Chester, Liverpool, Manchester and Carlisle**. Know where these cities are located on a map of the North West of England. Know that Manchester is the nearest city to Bolton.
- 2) Know that in the North-West of England, the counties are: **Cheshire, Merseyside, Greater Manchester, Lancashire and Cumbria**. Know that Bolton is located within the county of Greater Manchester.
- 3) Understand that in the Lake District is located in the North West of England in a county called Cumbria. Know that the Lake District is home to the highest mountain in England - **Scafell Pike**.
- 4) Know that tourism is people visiting places. It is very important to the Lake District- they have over 16 million visitors every year who come to walk, cycle, run, boat or just to look at the amazing scenery.
- 5) Know that there are 10 'boroughs' within Greater Manchester: **Bury, Rochdale, Oldham, Tameside, Stockport, Manchester, Trafford, Salford, Wigan and Bolton**.
- 6) Know that a river is a large natural stream of water flowing into the sea, a lake, or another river. Know five longest rivers in the UK: **River Severn, River Thames, River Trent, River Great Ouse and River Wye**. Plot these rivers on a map of the UK.
