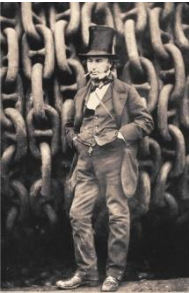

construction	The building of houses, factories, roads and bridges	<u>Isambard Kingdom Brunel</u> Isambard Brunel was a famous engineer. Born: 1806 Died: 1859. He built bridges, tunnels, railways, docks and ships. He built The Clifton Bridge in Bristol. It was a suspension bridge, and very high so ships could sail under it. Brunel built Paddington Station (1854) in London. Trains still use it. Brunel wanted to build the world's biggest ship- the Great Eastern. 	
bridge	A structure carrying a road, path or railways over an obstacle such as a river		
suspension bridge	A type of bridge that is supported from above by cables		
rigid	Unable to bend, stretch or twist easily. Not flexible		
flexible	Can bend easily without breaking		
landmark	A building which is easily noticed and can be used to find your location	Clifton Suspension Bridge, Bristol 	
drawbridge	A bridge that can be pulled up, for example to prevent people from getting into a castle	The Tees Transporter Bridge, Middlesbrough
